Dear 1st Presbyterian members & friends,

February-March 2018

In 2018, Ash Wednesday (the beginning of the season of Lent) falls on February 14th. Forty days plus six Sundays later, Easter Sunday falls on April 1st. Valentine's Day to April Fools' Day: what a strange coincidence of calendar!

And yet, knowing and accepting the love of God in Christ is a most important experience in life. In First John 4, we read: "And so we know and rely on the love God has for us. God is love. Whoever lives in love lives in God, and God in them... This is how God showed his love among us: He sent his one and only Son into the world that we might live through him." A Valentine from the Lord.

April Fools' Day began in the 1500s when the Gregorian calendar took over from the Julian. Those who forgot the change and attempted to celebrate New Year's (previously celebrated on the 1st of April) on the wrong date were teased as "April fools." In First Corinthians 4, Paul chastises some in the church for thinking they were oh so superior to others. With tongue-in-cheek he writes, "We are fools for Christ, but you are so wise in Christ! We are weak, but you are strong! You are honored, we are dishonored!"

But, are not we all "fools for Christ?" As Paul writes in Romans, "We preach Christ crucified: a stumbling block to Jews and foolishness to Gentiles... When we preach that Christ was crucified, the Jews are offended and the Gentiles say it's all nonsense."

The Bible has another comment for April Fools' Day in Proverbs 53:1: "The fool says in his heart, 'There is no God.' They are corrupt, and their ways are vile; there is no one who does good." And the 1963 Grammy song of the year from "Stop the World - I Want to Get Off" asked a great question: "What Kind of Fool Am I?"

On Ash Wednesday we begin a season of probing the depths of love that the Lord has for us. On Easter Sunday, with reckless abandon, we proclaim "Christ crucified and risen." It is there that we put our "foolish" faith, our trust in the grace of God, and seek to live as followers of Jesus. "When we in our foolishness thought we were wise/He played the fool and He opened our eyes/When we in our weakness believed we were strong/He became helpless to show we were wrong/And so we follow God's own fool/For only the foolish can tell/Believe the unbelievable/And come be a fool as well." (Michael Card).

FROM THE PASTORAL ASSOCIATE

Have you ever gone someplace new where you knew no one? New job? New school? New home? How easy or hard was it to feel welcome? These are all necessities sometimes in life. But what if you went someplace new where you didn't know anyone because you were seeking something? You went not out of necessity or obligation, but out of yearning? You were looking for friendship, or God, or inspiration, or comfort? How would you want to be welcomed?

We are blessed EVERY WEEK at First Pres with visitors. They come from far and wide for a variety of reasons. God brings them to us. They come not knowing anyone. How do we then welcome them and care for them?

The Bible is clear about how we treat those we do not know. Matthew 5 in the sermon on the mount Jesus goes as far to tell his followers that they are to love each other, even their enemies. He makes a good point in verses 46-47; "If you love those who love you, what reward will you get? Are not even the tax collectors doing that? 47 And if you greet only your own people, what are you doing more than others? Do not even pagans do that?" Of course it is OK to come to church and enjoy and value those we already love. But Jesus is pointing out that as Christians we have a calling to love those we don't even know yet. That means we need to welcome them in.

I have had members, yes members, that are here and love First Pres. tell me that when they came they were not welcomed much. I know you are a loving bunch. So we just need to do better at this. ALL of us. Whether you sneak in the back

each week just because you like the organist, or whether you are a deacon or elder, or you come just because your friend gives you a ride. ALL of us need to make visitors a priority EVERY Sunday.

This is a goal of mine for 2018... that First Pres. welcome visitors and take the time to help them realize they are valued and that we want to know them better. This means greeting them, asking for their name, finding out more about them, connecting them with someone in the congregation that they might have something in common with, and even inviting them to lunch. Yes, lunch! Presbyterians love food! I know First Pres. can do this. Let's value and love our visitors every week.

We received 112% of the amount budgeted for Estimated Giving. We received 99% of budgeted income and spent 98% of budgeted expenses. For 2017, we were able to meet all of our mission and ministry costs. We received nearly 20% of our income in December, and a large percentage of that amount came in after Christmas. We appreciate the many large and small gifts and the efforts the congregation made in giving extra gifts at the end of the year. Saturday, March 31, 10:00 AM

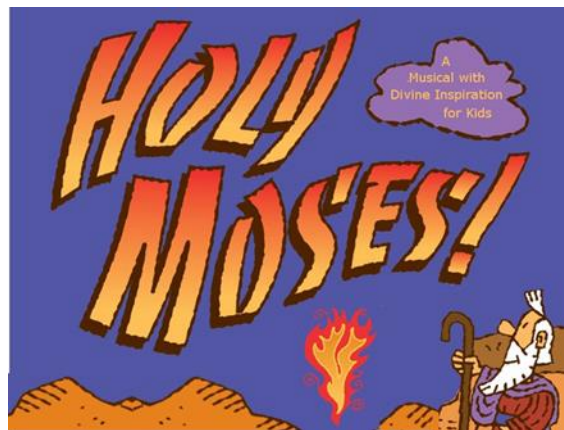

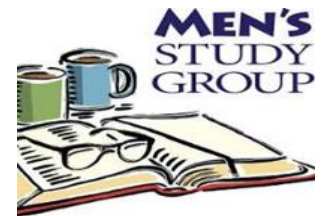


Tuesday Men's Breakfast:
