FROM THE PASTORAL ASSOCIATE

In the sermon that I shared in November regarding Paul's emphasis on Christ as the foundation of the church, I asked if First Presbyterian is willing to be founded on Christ and nothing else. I asked if we are willing to be different than the world. Rev. David Wells, professor at Gordon-Conwell Theological Seminary, wrote a book titled *The Courage to be Protestant*. I want to share a couple of paragraphs from this book with you and hope you will consider what it should mean for First Pres in 2018.

"The church is not our creation. It is not our business. It is not there for us to advance our careers in it. It is not there for our own successes. It is not a business at all. The church, in fact, was never our idea in the first place...It is true that churches are also organizations. But it is not their organizational side that defines them...the Church is utterly unlike any other organization in the world. In the church are those who belong to another world...when it gathers, it is hearing a summons to stand before the God of all eternity, to worship in awe before him, to acknowledge his greatness, to humble itself, to learn to live in this world on God's terms, and to do its business as his. It is in all these ways otherworldly... Churches that want to influence their culture are so often tempted to think that to be effective they must hide their otherworldliness and become slickly 'this-worldly'... Churches that actually do influence the culture – here is the paradox – are those that distance themselves from it in their internal life. They do not offer what can already be had on secular terms in their culture. They are an alternative to it... their preoccupations are with the God of their salvation who in his

holiness and grace is completely unlike anything we find in life...The most important thing we learn about the church is that it is God who builds it...Of course it is true that the church needs to be led, taught, pastored, and organized... But we must start with the bedrock truth that it is God alone who builds and nourishes it. The reason we must start here is that this divine work is what prescribes what the church is and how it is best served."

Have you ever thought of church this way? As "otherworldly?" As being owned and operated by God and a portal to God's kingdom? Can we really operate the church that way? Not only can we, but we must. It simply is not ours. I pray we find the ways in which God wants to use us (First Presbyterian) and continue to use us for God's purposes and bring more of those in this world into God's presence and glory.

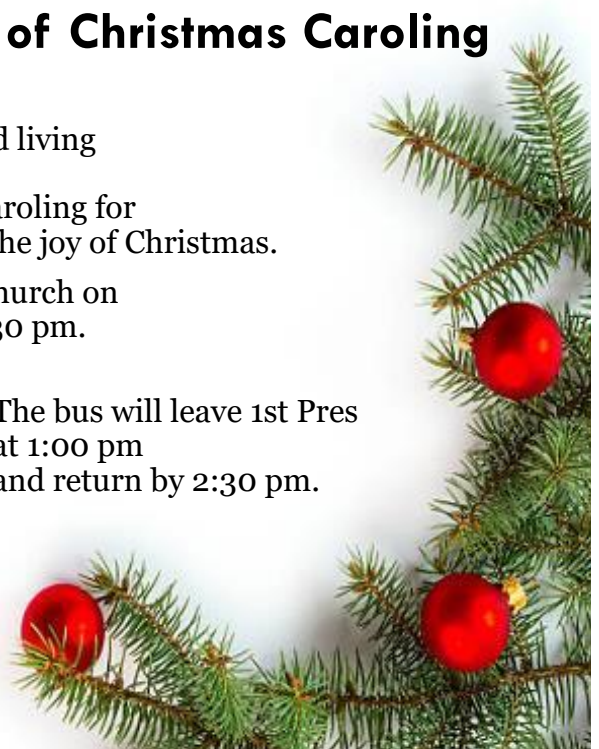
An Afternoon of Christmas Caroling

BASEMENT KITCHEN

First Presbyterian Church
Basement Kitchen

Recently our basement commercial kitchen was inspected by the fire inspector. He told us that we must install an Ansul fire suppression system if we would like to cook anything with grease laden vapors. The Ansul fire suppression system is set up to put out any grease fire that occurs on the stove and in the ovens, including the convection ovens. Our current hood system and venting would need to be brought up to current code and a make-up air system would need to be installed. The make-up air system consists of venting that will go from outside the building and in front of the hood system over the stove. It will need its own heating and air conditioning system that run even after the fire alarm system shuts off the rest of the HVAC system in the building. In order to install this system, it will require a building permit and the plans will need to be approved by Salt Lake City and must meet both Salt Lake City fire safety code and health code.

We have received bids on the work that is required to bring the basement kitchen up to code. It is estimated to cost between \$20K-\$30K provided nothing else is required to meet the code when we have the plans approved and the improvements are being made. The church does not have money in the budget to meet these costs. We are looking to raise funds towards these improvements and appreciate any donations that are made. The proceeds (~\$3,000) from

our recent Scottish Festival have been designated to go towards these renovations as the kitchen is instrumental in providing a successful festival each year as well as many other events that are held during the year. We have also received \$2,500 in generous donations.

While we are raising funds for the kitchen renovation, we will have limited use of the stove and the ovens. We can use the stove and the ovens to warm food that does not contain grease of any sort. This includes any meat due to the fats in the meat, butter, oil, shortening, etc. The fire department starts fines at \$5,000 per incident or item cooked that violates code and the insurance will not cover the cost of a fire to the building. Due to the severity of the issue we are placing strict limitations on the use of the kitchen. All items requiring the use of the stove or ovens must be preapproved. The kitchen will be kept locked and the gas to these items will be kept off. In order to use the kitchen, permission and approval must be asked for at least 3 business days in advance (keep in mind the FPC office is closed on Mondays). We ask for your support by way of prayers, donations, volunteering to help with or head up fundraisers, and following the new guidelines of the kitchen.
