FROM THE PASTORAL ASSOCIATE

It has been 500 years since the event we call the “Reformation.” Although we use the date of Luther’s *95 Theses* in 1517 as the marker, what fueled the Reformation was already very much in motion in Europe in terms of corruption in Rome, shifts in education and scholarship, politics, science, and society. Today there is an ongoing debate on whether the Reformation was a success or a disaster when it comes to its effects on the church. If we look at the current landscape, in 2010 the *Atlas of Global Christianity* recorded 38,000 denominations worldwide. Compare this to Jesus’ prayer in John 17:

20 “My prayer is not for them alone. I pray also for those who will believe in me through their message, 21 that all of them may be one, Father, just as you are in me and I am in you. May they also be in us so that the world may believe that you have sent me. 22 I have given them the glory that you gave me, that they may be one as we are one— 23 I in them and you in me—so that they may be brought to complete unity.

Do we have a problem here? 38,000 denominations and “complete unity?” Has Protestantism become so plural and fractured that it has failed? The fact that we have a secular and individualistic society (see my last Chimes article) does factor in. However, I would argue a misunderstanding and misuse of the tenants of Reformed theology also play a part. The Five So-

las (*sola*=“alone”) which are grace alone (*sola gratia*), faith alone (*sola fide*), scripture alone (*sola Scriptura*), in Christ alone (*Solus Christus*), and for the glory of God alone (*Soli Deo Gloria*) are not five categories that have no connection with one another. They are also not individual applications. They are all meant within the church.

Take *in Christ alone* (*Solus Christus*) for example. “In Christ alone” means that there is only one mediator between God and man, and that is Christ Jesus (1 Tim. 2:5). It does NOT mean that Christ is all we need and the church is superfluous. When we are in Christ, we are grafted into a body of Christ. The vehicle for that body is the church. I know you have heard people say they are “spiritual” and believe in God, but they don’t need the church. Well here is the truth: they DO need the church.

As we draw closer to Reformation Sunday in October, we will look at these Five Solas and how they are meant to play out in faith and the church. The **church is critical** to each one of these. None of them were meant to come to fruition in individuals in their homes or places of work. The church is the crucial body in which each of the Five Solas function. And if we were more willing to treat them as important as they are and within the framework of the church, we would not have such a problem with unity.

Ding Canyon is fairly straightforward; however, Dang Canyon was not for the faint of heart. Scouts had many challenges in the form of large drops in a tight slot canyon partially filled with water. The five mile hike took about 7 hrs to complete and everyone walked out with increased confidence. The day after this hike the Troop went into Goblin Valley State Park and played among the hoodoos.

After many months of preparation, on June 18th, 12 members of Troop 34 departed for a one week backpacking adventure into Zion National Park. Temperatures were 100+° and great care was taken to make sure everyone wore sunscreen, stayed hydrated and had fun. When obtaining a wilderness permit the Troop was given a strong reminder from the ranger that it was going to be hot and after going through our preparations and making sure that everyone was prepared, we were

finally given our permit. The Troop focused most of the time on the East Rim section of Zion Park traversing up and down small canyons. Available water sources became the epicenter of their activities. Sleeping in hammocks became the easiest way to keep cool at night. After a couple of days enjoying the scenery, Troop

eventually reached the high point of Cable Mountain. It was a dizzying view (2300') below, to the trail to be used while exiting the rim. The next day Scouts hiked down into Echo Canyon and set up camp for the night. Come morning, it was time to head back down to the serious heat and our final night of camping at the Watchman Campground. Scouts

traveled back through Echo Canyon, encountering lots of people hiking up. It did not take long to get to the valley road, then the Temple of Sinawava and a nice swimming hole. Their final adventure on this trip was working with a guide for some rappelling. The guides were great, and they were able to participate in two rappels and many chimney sections. This was indeed a memorable trip!
