I hope you will participate in our Holy Week services—this is a great chance to reflect on what difference Jesus really makes in your life. The great thing is that this is an opportunity for adventure, experiment and new relevance. I can't wait! Similarly, your PNC is doing excellent work and starting to interview candidates. God has already chosen our new pastor, and he or she will be a wonderful gift to us!

I am looking forward to our sermon series this spring—helping us all to think through the multifaceted reality of the Good News of Jesus, and also to the fun of Youth Sunday, of the Walk For Water, and our Festival of Prayer. As we all start to emerge, blinking, from our homes, we can reconnect in new ways with each other and with Jesus, and we can all grow more and more into the people God made us to be.

FROM THE PASTORAL ASSOCIATE

I have to admit I was surprised. I thought when we opened up for in-person worship that every spot marked for seating would be filled. And, well, they aren't...not yet. We have missed each other so much this past year. I have been starved to see people that I care about. So why are we not back together yet? I think there are a few reasons and some are good reasons to stick with online worship and some may not be.

One reason might be that you are at risk and not fully vaccinated yet. **That is a great reason to not return to in-person worship yet.** Another reason might be that you like staying in pajamas and not having to drive to church. This is NOT a good reason to miss in-person worship. We are designed to be in community with each other and church is better done in person when possible.

Another reason might be anxiety or fear of reentering the world. This is very understandable. According to the Harvard Business Review anxiety is nearly universal right now. There are two drivers of anxiety during this pandemic and post pandemic. One is understandably safety. When people are worried about their safety they become anxious. The pandemic made us feel unsafe in many ways. And now that some things are being eased, it does not help that we have had two mass shootings in the last week. Just when we thought we could start gathering again, we are reminded of a threat of gathering.

The other thing that can generate anxiety is our lifestyle and lifestyle changes. In the last year we have become conditioned to living in a completely different way. We have stayed away from the church building for a year. Now changing how we live again can cause anxiety, even if it is going back to "normal" (which it really isn't).

Some of the symptoms of anxiety are avoidance and lack of trust. Are you experiencing any of this? We want you to be well physically and spiritually and emotionally. And it is ok to have anxiety right now. But let's help each other as we move through it to a safer time.

There is a lot of confusion about how to reenter the world right now. Experts are suggesting that we "ease" back into things. **Don't rush.** For example, if you have hardly left the house in a year, start small. Try the convenience store before Costco. And although experts say to take it slow, they also say **don't avoid.** You do need community and other people in your life. What we went through this last year is not natural and certainly not the way any of us are meant to live or what the church was meant to be.

What would God say about all this? Well, the Bible tells us that God wants us to trust in him with all of our hearts (Proverbs 3:5), and to not worry or be anxious (Matthew 6). Easier said than done right? This is why we have been putting videos on the website about emotional wellness during the pandemic. And this is why we have each other as a Christian community. If you are struggling with anxiety over reentering our world, you are not alone. Know that millions feel the way you do and that God knows what you feel every moment. Pastor Steve and I would be happy to visit with you and pray with you. Take a few minutes to read Psalm 37 today. And let it be an assurance for you for God's power as well as God's care for you.

Per Capita is the amount that every Presbyterian (U.S.A.) church pays for each member listed on its active membership roll. Per Capita helps fund administrative costs for the denomination, but a large portion comes back to Utah for ministry and mission support. Of the \$39.45 per capita for each active member on our rolls, the Presbytery of Utah receives \$27.47, Synod of the Rocky Mountains receives \$3.00 and General Assembly receives \$8.98. Please mark your gift as Per Capita or place it in the blue envelope at the front of your box of offering envelopes.

You may write one check to cover several gifts. If you would like to send one check for several different funds, you may do the following: In the bottom left-hand memo area designate how much for each fund. For example: A check for \$200.00 may be divided in the following way: Church Operations or Estimate of Giving - \$150.00; Deacons - \$25.00; One Great Hour of Sharing- \$25.00.

The church is now using a new data base called Breeze to keep track of the congregational information and contributions. Quarterly statements for contributions will be sent out in April. FROM THE SESSION

These concepts are also critical for a church to grow and be a “conversion church” based on research outlined in *You Found Me: New Research on How Unchurched Nones, Millennials, and Irreligious Are Surprisingly Open to Christian Faith*, by Rick Richardson (which the Session read together last year). The pandemic has presented many challenges for us living as a church community and maybe even further emphasized our need for community. We are excited about some upcoming opportunities to be a community together, whether in person or virtually, and we hope you will engage in them and connect with each other!

Worship First, corporate worship is vital to Christians, and in-person worship has begun again to provide this nourishment. We hope that you will RSVP and attend as you feel comfortable doing so and as we continue to follow public health guidelines. Even though we cannot have Fellowship Hour in person yet, it is great even just to wave at each other again

Fellowship And speaking of Fellowship Hour – we hosted our first virtual Fellowship Hour on March 21! We hope that these virtual Fellowship Hours provide a way for us to chat with each other and provide support and encouragement. We will continue to hold these virtual Fellowship Hours in the upcoming weeks and hope you can join us!

Breeze Finally, the church has purchased the church management software Breeze. This is a wonderful new tool that will help all of us connect more easily. There are many features that we are beginning to explore and use. We hope that it will create a means for staff and church (elders, deacons, small group leaders) easier to organize and communicate with the right audiences. We will also be able to have the church directory online, with contact information for others available for any of our congregation via a login. We hope that you all will use it to be able to reach out to each other individually outside of church events. Look for more details in the coming weeks and months.

PASTOR NOMINATION COMMITTEE

Greetings to all from your Pastor Nomination Committee (PNC). With our Lord's help and guidance, this year is turning out to be full of adventure and new experiences. BUILDING AND GROUNDS

Building Maintenance:

This spring we will to repair selected areas of the sandstone walls, walks, stairs and repair the joints between the stones. Once selected areas are completed, we plan on spraying the stone with a weather protectorate to seal the sandstone from future moisture damage. Our first priority will be the front of the church facing So. Temple as the sandstone walls and especially the steps in that area are really deteriorated. This may turn out to be a multi-year project depending on the costs involved. We will also be looking at our air conditioning system for both roof mounted and ground mounted units. We know this effort will require some units to be replaced. Very little was accomplished last year due to related pandemic issues and the facility not being fully utilized. Hopefully, this will change during 2021.

Gardening Opportunities for Individuals and Families

Well, it's that time of the year and the tulips & daffodils are breaking ground again! Also with the warming weather the weeds are also showing up. This year is FPC's 150th yr celebration and we want our outside flowerbeds to show our love for the community. We

need to repair sprinklers, install weed barrier, do some replanting, lots of trimming/pruning and general clean-up. We are also planning on relocating the old wooden sign that previously was installed in the Southwest flowerbed. It is currently being refurbished by Bob Cook and will have new lighting installed wherever it gets relocated. We will be setting up flowerbed sections again this year asking for volunteers to accept the responsibility to maintain those small sections (maybe 9 or 10 total) for the season. The front flowerbed facing So. Temple with the roses is already reserved, but there will be plenty of opportunities in other areas to get your hands and knees dirty. We need to include the parking lot this year which is one area needing clean up and weed guard installed. We will be scheduling a meeting to look at the flowerbed situation and I'll have flowerbed sections identified that will be available for assignment. If you would like to volunteer to help in this area please contact either Chuck Britter or young Mike Imperiale and we'll make sure that you get an invite to the meeting.

MEN'S MINISTRY
